Annual Activity Report 2021-2022

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Brief History:

The Indian Centre for Integrated Development (ICID) is a registered, not for profit organization committed to the protection and advocacy of rights of the disadvantaged children, youth and women in urban and rural areas of the Nagpur district. The vision is a just and free society where child rights are recognized and protected, leading to integral and responsible human development. The mission is to inspire, enable and empower children and young people to become actors in their development for a just and free society.

The organization provides support and care for children who live on the street; are begging and rag picking; are engaged in paid work; are abandoned/orphaned/lost/missing/run away/trafficked; are/have been abused/exploited; are/have been neglected; are/have been in distress; victims of substance abuse; have a disability; have dropped out of school; are in conflict with law and are living with/affected by HIV/AIDS.

1. YUVAJYOTHI:

Yuvajyothi occupied 32 Boys for care and protection and 8 boys are under the aftercare program. Three new Boys from difficult situation sheltered at YCH. Among 32 boys eleven boys are pursuing higher secondary school education. Two boys Sameksh & Rohan were enrolled Bachelor Business Administration (BBA) and Bachelor of Fine Arts degree course respectively. During the festival Boys visited their families and relatives too. Boys were engaged in academic, life skills and social learning engagement activities.

Education Learning Engagement: The conducted activities were focusing on the revision and increasing the understanding of the contents in the virtual classes conducted by the schools. Boys were occupied with home-based tuitions according to their classes and age it helped in enhancing basic literacy, numerical abilities, and spoken English. Towards developing reading habits and increasing general awareness newspaper reading, watching TV news, and book reading practices are scheduled in the boy's daily timetable. Regular brainstorming discussions, reading, debate contests were great openings for the boys to boost their interest in studies and make active participation. Boys were also engaged in various competitions such as General knowledge, Quiz, English word spelling etc. On 19 October a fancy-dress competition was organized for the Boys in which Boys has to dress up themselves with newspapers as kings of an ancient times. The activity could develop interest in reading history. On 10th November Boys were taken to Narrow Gauge Rail Museum, here kids collected information regarding Railway engine, Wagons, bogie etc. On 5th June Boys took participation in the science quiz competitions organised by Raman Science Centre Nagpur. On 24th June boys were taken for Metro Fun ride which was refreshing moment to get out of the house after lockdown open.

Life Skills Learning Engagements: On 25 September activity-based session on moral values was introduced to the Boys by the students from engineering college. Boys were explained moral values such as truth, freedom, honesty, fairness, kindness, politeness, and respect toward others. They were also sensitized on their duties towards society. On 10th January Life skill session on creative thinking was conducted for the Boys and the follow up sessions for the same were conducted. In the month of February extempore speech camp activities were introduced to them.

Art & Craft Learning Engagement: On the occasion of Diwali & Christmas Boys were involved in Diya painting and making stars for decorations. On 3rd July Boys took part in virtual training on Art of making planters.

Social Learning Engagement: To make the Boys sensitized and connect with social structure, norms as well as importance of the day's YCH observed following social days & festivals with the Boys.

2. CHILDLINE an emergency helpline for Boys in distress:

Case Interventions: During the reporting period team could reach 317 Boys in distress who contacted on 1098 helpline. The calls were divided under following categories,

Medical help – 12, shelter- 24, Rescue from abuse-36, Sponsorship- 90, Child labour- 6, Child Lost- 5, Parent asking for help-10, Emotional support & guidance, Referred by other Childline-4, Unclassified- 45, Not located-5, Chat call- 2, Other interventions regarding Balsangopan-59 and Corona need food-7.

Outreach: to reach the Boys in difficult situations and making visibility of CHILDLINE services outreach activities in zone no 7, 9 & 10 communities were carried out for 434 hours. Team conducted Individual outreach-19, small group outreach-92 and participated in 6 mass outreaches along with other CHILDLINE partners. During the year about 10000 population covered.

Open House: Eight open house programs were conducted with following COVID-19 protocols. The issues related Child Rights, Child Sexual Abuse, Prevention from Covid-19 and Team work were tackled during the activity. Total 175 Boys were engaged in the program.

Awareness & Sensitizations:

- ❖ Poster Sticking Drive: During second lockdown CL team was requested stick posters related to the WCD scheme for the Boys who had lost their parents due to COVID-19 infection in COVID-19 hospitals by Department of Women and Child Development. During the drive CL team visited 13 different hospitals for poster sticking and disseminating the information.
- ❖ Adolescents Sensitization: During the program adolescent girls were sensitized on menstrual hygiene and COVID-19. Fourteen girls participated in the session. They were provided with hygiene kit including menstrual pads, bathing soaps, detergent soaps, tooth paste and tooth brush.
- ❖ Psychosocial Support for Boys during COVID -19: Virtual training program was organised for the adolescent girls on 30th June. During the session girls were explained on positive living and stress management during the pandemic situations.
- ❖ Awareness program on CHILDLINE 1098 and Child Sexual Exploitation: The program was conducted on 29th July at ICDS Centre No. 103, Binaki Mangalwari. Participants were engaged in interactive sessions with educational games. Fifteen girls participated in the program.
- ❖ Awareness Program On CSA: Three awareness programs were conducted in the month of December.
- ❖ Drive for Boys on the Street: CL team in collaboration with District women and child development and District child protection Unit conducted drive for the Boys living on the street. Total 20 Boys's Social Investigation reports were submitted to the Child welfare committee and 14 Boys were produced online before the CWC for the need of care & Support.
- ❖ **ICHILDLINE Se Dosti (CSD) Week:** CSD week was observed from 14th to 20th November on the occasion of Children's's Day on 14th November and Universal Child Right Day on 20th November. Various activities were carried out at the field level they were recreational activities at Child care institutions, targeted communities; Sensitization of allied systems stakeholders through tying CSD band to them, Rally in the communities.

3. URJA Project: *For empowerment of the socio-economically disadvantaged urban women through sustainable livelihood options*

The project was restarted in the second week of October after receiving the green signal for vocational classes by the government. There were three centres with one old Niramal Jyothi and two new centres were initiated in the new location of the city at Pawan Shakti Nagar and Adiwasi Prakash Nagar. Total 88 trainees enrolled in a six-month tailoring course at four centres, Pawan Shakti Nagar- 16, Adiwasi Prakash Nagar- 26, Nirmal Jyothi- 26 & Hazaripahad- 20.

Project starting committees (PSC) were formed at all three centres there are 6, 7 & 6 PSC members respectively in each centre. PSC members had explained their important role in the successful implementation of the project. Total 21 meetings were conducted of PSC members from all four centres. Various activities were carried out to run the program smoothly and achieve program outcome.

Trainees were involved in a meeting once in a month to discuss the challenges and solutions to tackle them. Total 22 meetings with students were conducted. Team conducted 165 days outreach for two hours each day for the home visits of the trainees and spreading the information about the centre's services.

Social Legal & Protection training: To make the participants informed and updated about the social legal system available for the affected women from Violence one day training programs were organised at all centres. Resource person explained Domestic Violence Act through sharing the cases dealt by her. List of allied systems available for the women were shared with training participants. In between inputs on various government schemes were also discussed. One seventy-two participants sharpen their knowledge from the training.

Maharashtra Girl Child Day: On the occasion of Savitribai Phule Birth anniversary 3rd January the day was declared as a Maharashtra Girl Child Day. During the week three awareness program at Pawanshakti Nagar, Hajaripahad and Nirmal Jyothi centre were conducted.

4. KISHORI: *Empowering Marginalised Adolescent Girls for Enhanced Reproductive Health and Resilience for Gender Equality in Nagpur City*

The project began in the month of October. The project is being implemented in twenty marginalized communities of the city and connected with 317 girls in 25 groups.

Promotion for education: Girls were at home since pandemic situation occurs. Regular home visits and motivations to the parents and girls impacted in continuing the online classes. Adolescents' girls were called for the meetings and they were sensitized by giving various examples of successful women. Total 152 meetings with girls were conducted.

Life skills & Reproductive Health Education: life skills on Self-esteem, Communication, Problem Solving and Decision making were conducted with 25 groups of the girls. It was observed that girls are enjoying the sessions and they were taking active participation in learning. Their parents shared that the girls share the learnings of the session with them. They became positive towards their self-image.

Capacity building of Peer Leaders: Among 25 groups 40 adolescents were selected as a peer leader who will be motivator and communicator for the groups. One day training was organised for the group of 20 peer leaders separately on the following topics

Introduction of peer leaders their roles and responsibilities, Secondary sex characteristics, Adolescents Rights & Child Sexual abuse. Participants were engaged in various games and energetic activities to make the learning easy.

Kishori Shiksha: Total 19 groups with 201 adolescents' girls in six communities were engaged in life skill education program.

5. **COVID relief services:**

Thirty-seven children were supported for educational material; three youths were sponsored for college & exam fess. Three youths were provided laptops for education purpose.

Medical assistance was provided to 33 people including providing medicine, medical test and hospitalization expenses.

Roashan Kits Support was provided to 1475 people at Slums area of urban Nagpur and Ghoti, Bendoli & Bothali rural part of Nagpur district.

Three hundred and two adolescent girls were supported for hygiene kits including menstrual pads, bathing soap, tooth paste & brush. Sixteen women were supported for income generation activities.

6. **Deepshikha Resource Centre:**

Forty eighth Boys of 3 to 6 age group were engaged in nonformal education from Gond Community and Tulsinagar area. Boys were mentally prepared to join the formal education in the coming academic year. Library facilities were accessed by 32 Boys and 8 women from the community. Team conducted regular outreach in the nearby communities to identify the children's issues and livelihood promotions. With regular engagement with government stakeholders' vaccination camps for the Boys were organised at the centre and team ensured that the community members accessed the facility.

7. **Engagement with Vitamin Angles:**

Vitamin A supplement and D-worming tablets were distributed among 163 children between the age group 6 month to 5 years. Several times sensitization of the parents regarding the Vitamin A and D-worming supplements importance were done.

8. **Other Program:**

- ❖ **Menstrual Hygiene Day:** On the occasion of the day a virtual training program for adolescent girls was conducted on May 28th. A total of 35 girls and 11 other community stake holders participated in the training.
- ❖ **World Environment Day:** The day was observed virtually on 5th June due to the lockdown in the city. Boys were engaged online in drawing and essay competitions. There were 15 Boys from different communities joined virtually in the program. Boys were appreciated and motivated with prizes.
- ❖ **World Day against Child Labour:** Drawing competitions were organised virtually as well as physically in different five Boys's homes in the city on 12th June. A total of 76 Boys took active participation in the programs. They were awarded with prizes and certificates.
- ❖ **International Youth Day:** An awareness program was conducted on 12th August at Samta Nagar and Vandevi Nagar. The theme for the day was "the role of the youth in creating child-friendly community". Participants were engaged with audio-visuals and interactive session.

Several performances of dance, speech, essays were presented by the participants. A total of 58 youths participated in the program.

- ❖ **Suraksha Ganth:** On the occasion of Rakshabandhan, a program was conducted at Yashodhara Nagar and Kapil Nagar Police Station on 23rd August. It was organized with the purpose of eliminating the fear of the police in the mind of the Boys and ensuring support from the police system to the Boys whenever they required. Boys were sensitized with this activity that Rakshabandhan festival was not only for brothers and sisters but it can be celebrated with each and every person who protected and supported them. The boys and girls tied Rakhi to the police staff. A total of 23 Boys participated in the program and 77 Police personnel from both the police stations attended the program and appreciated the efforts of the Boys.
- ❖ **National Sports Day:** On this occasion a program was conducted at Barse Nagar Pachpawali on 30th August 2021. Boys were explained the importance of the day and they were made aware of several games. They were given the information about the sports achievers and their struggles. Boys also took active part in various sports such as kabaddi, kho-kho, running race, rope skipping etc. A total of 96 Boys took active part in the program with the support of twelve community youth.
- ❖ **International Girl Child Day:** Two program were conducted on 10 and 11 October at Pilinadi and Bairagipura. Drama and dance were presented by the girls on the topic of Beti Bachao Beti Padhav and a quiz competition was held. Thirty girls and 5 women participated in the program
- ❖ **Constitution Day:** On 26 November programs were conducted ion the various communities of the ICID. At Sanjay Gandhi Nagar, Bhandewadi & Godavari Nagar community members along with children were explained the information of Indian Constitution. The participants took pledge towards respecting and following the constitution preamble. Team could reach 137 children, youth and other stake holders.
- ❖ **Child Right Week:** Creating awareness and sensitization about girl child rights campaign was observed in various communities such as Futala, Hazaripahad, Sangharsh Nagar, Bidgavn, and Depti signal area from 14th November to 20th November. The activities conducted were poster making competitions on girl Child importance, female foreside & Gender inequalities; felicitation of the girl child who scored highest marks in the board exam, Child right Poster exhibition, and reading. Total 448 Boys, youth and community stake holders were participated in the programs.
- ❖ **International Women's Day:** On the occasion of the day various programs in the targeted communities" Gender Equality Today for a Sustainable Tomorrow". One 8th March event was organised at Chndmari Devsthan for the women participants from east part of Nagpur, over 350 women participated in the program. On 9th March event was organised at Hazaripahad area for the women from west part of Nagpur, here over 250 women participated. Bothe the programs were resource full for the women where they update their knowledge on Health care, preparations for the government service, gender equality; here they came forward and presented their talent through dance & singing. Health camps were organised at both places equipped with free BMD, Sugar, HB, Thyroid tests as well as free medicine for the common illness.

On 14th March event was organised at Nirmal Nagar Gorewada, Women were engaged in various cultural performances and poster related to women rights reading competitions.

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
