WHAT YUVAJYOTHI PROVIDES



EDUCATION

27 children routinely attended ten different schools and colleges. The children's progress was monitored on a regular basis by their class teachers. Children were encouraged to participate in a variety of extracurricular activities arranged by their schools.

All of the children at YCH attended regular school and performed well in their respective classes within their abilities. Four boys passed the 10th grade examinations, and two passed the 12th grade exam.

COLLABORATION WITH MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Make a Difference, a volunteer organization whose volunteers were consistent throughout the year and provided much-needed assistance to children's education; the classes were effective and interesting, assisting the children in managing and completing the portion for exams. Every Saturday evening and Sunday morning the classes were held for children of Class 5th to 12th. A total of 20 children attended these classes.

NUTRITION

Under the supervision of a social worker, children were given nutritional food. As a result, it serves an important function in promoting the boys' physical growth and development. Proper diet promotes brain development and improves cognitive processes, allowing children to process information efficiently and make sound judgments.

RESULT

COUNSELLING

All of the children at Yuvajyothi participated in individual and group counselling sessions for children, which were done on a regular basis using both direct and indirect counselling methods by a psychologist assisted by social workers. Children who demonstrated symptoms of behavioural problems, concentration problems, attention problems, low self-esteem, learning disabilities, aggression issues, sluggish learning challenges, depression, family issues, and post-traumatic stress received additional care.

METHODS AND ACTIVITIES

Concentration exercises, paragraph counting, palmar reflex integration exercises, meditation music, grounding meditation, visual therapy exercises, and mirror therapy.

RESULT

- Improved communication and interpersonal skills, increased self-acceptance and self-esteem
- The ability to change self-defeating behaviours and patterns.
- Benefits include improved emotional expression and management
- Relief from depression, anxiety, and other mental health issues.
- Improved confidence and decision-making abilities.
- Effective stress management.



DEVELOPMENTAL ACTIVITIES:

SPORTS AND GAMES

- Children were guided and encouraged to participate in a variety of games and sporting activities. Everyday children mostly participated in team games such as football, which increased cohesiveness and friendship among them.
- Children were invited to St. Ann's School, Khaparkheda, for a football match and experience sharing with other school children on the 10th of September 2023
- In the month of November 2023 Tapish played football match for District level at Kholapur.
- In the month of December 2023 Rohan played carom at District level
- December 2023 Aman played State level football matches at Mumbai

ENGLISH SPEAKING CLASSES

During the summer vacation, children attended Basic English classes in which spoken English was taught. The classes were also child-friendly, with the children actively participating.

RECREATION

Children also took part in a variety of organized recreational activities, including singing, group building games, carom, chess, and ludo. Children were also given access to television so they could watch movies and sports matches.



MUSIC AND DANCE CLASSES

In the months of May and June, dance classes were conducted for the children. Children were taught music and songs on Sundays and Thursday by the students of Pilar Niketan and St. Charles student.

HEALTH CARE FACILITIES

- Dr. Rajkumar Rughwani, Dr. Punchi, Dr. Borkar, and other doctors provided regular medical help to the children.
- All of these hospitals are located near Yuvajyothi's residence.
- The doctor provided the utmost attention and preference to all Yuvajyothi children.
- On December 22, 2023, all of the children's haemoglobin levels were examined and their blood groups were identified.



BASIC COMPUTER LITERACY

The activity helps the children develop cognitive and creative skills. Four children were sent to Rishi Computers for a three-month MSCIT course. Anush scored 82%, Aditya 83%, Ayush 80%, and Ganesh 70%. The students were taught how to use Gmail, basic internet browsing, and Microsoft tools like Word, Excel, etc.

PARTICIPATION IN CULTURAL EVENTS

The children were encouraged and prepared to perform Bollywood dance routines. Children took part in cultural activities on numerous occasions such as Foundation Day, Diwali, Christmas Day, Balmela, and so on.

URJA PROGRAM

PROJECT GOAL

To contribute to the empowerment of socio-economically deprived urban women including adolescent girls and female population in the proposed 10 slum communities of Nagpur city through sustainable livelihood options under tailoring training.

OBJECTIVE OF THE PROJECT

To enhance vocational skills for self-reliance among adolescent girls and women in slum communities; To promote hygiene practices among adolescent girls and women to enhance their reproductive and general health; To increase awareness among women including adolescent girls about social legal protection schemes and services.

PROJECT STRATEGY

Vocational training programs in garment manufacture for designated 200 beneficiaries will be offered in four villages in two batches of six months each over the course of a year. Improving their socioeconomic situation by offering knowledge on personal and family health, social legal rights, and business training. Fill the baseline assessment form through regular outreach and surveys.

TAILORING TRAINING

Within a year, key beneficiaries were identified in two batches of six months in four of the proposed ten communities, and vocational training in garment production was provided. A total of 166 women and girls benefited from the vocational training between April 2023 and March 2024; of these, 60 were trained at the Nirmaljyothi Centre, 38 at Asha Centre, 24 at Deepshikha Centre, and 44 at Nandanvan Centre. During the six-month garment training program, women learned how to thread a needle, operate a machine, cut paper, sew a dhoti, make a simple blouse, make four tuxedos, make a simple salwar, make a pattern salwar, make a simple kurti, make a lined frock, make a palazzo, and more. During the course of one year, 37 trainees from the four centers experienced a variety of personal and societal challenges and opted to terminate and drop out of the program.

CHALLENGES

Community outreach and home visits aimed at beneficiary identification have revealed issues such as girls being married off at a young age, Muslim families not being allowed to send their daughters away from home, and a dearth of training rooms available for rent in impoverished areas.

TRAINEES' MEETING

OBJECTIVE

To organize a monthly meeting for all Centre trainees till training is completed. During the meeting, the trainees' personal social difficulties and sewing training issues were discussed, as well as assistance and information about numerous laws were provided.



PROCEDURE:

From April 2023 to April 2024, Deepshikha Centre hosted seven trainee meetings, Nandanvan Centre hosted ten, Nirmaljyothi Centre hosted twelve, and Asha Centre hosted ten trainee meetings, for a total of 38 meetings. The above goal was achieved during the meeting.

CHALLENGES

Before taking the meeting, trainees have to be repeatedly encouraged to come for the meeting by giving home and centre visit. Students were absent from meetings for a variety of reasons, including a water problem in the town, local festivals and activities, etc.

ATTAINMENTS

The trainee meetings achieved its objectives in accordance with the ones described above. During the meeting, the trainees present discussed training-related challenges and found solutions by providing constructive counsel and addressing the trainees' own social issues.

OUTREACH

OBJECTIVE

To do outreach in the targeted communities to encourage participation in training by disseminating information about tailoring training. To observe issues faced by the people in the community, offering advice, and planning events pertaining to a range of community concerns.

PROCEDURE

Deepshikha Centre trainers conducted 102 days of outreach in Tulshinagar, Surajnagar, Tulsi nagar Gond Community, Abbumiya nagar, Odia Community, Girjanagar, Antojinagar, and Bhandewadi, while Nandanvan Centre trainers conducted 72 days of outreach in Nandanvan slum, Sadbhavna

Nagar, and Asha Centre trainers conducted 99 days of outreach in Hazaripahad slum, Chintamani Nagar, Gayatri Nagar, Ganga Nagar, and Nirmaljyothi Centre.

PROJECT STEERING COMMITTEE (PSC)

OBJECTIVES

The Project Steering Committee (PSC) shall meet once a month until the completion of its six-month course. Each centre will have a Project Steering Committee (PSC) that consists of community leaders and volunteers who will identify beneficiaries, motivate them on a regular basis, monitor project activities, and assist the women in various training programs that will be carried out until the initiative comes to an end. And to enhance involvement by inspiring people to become more socially aware, to improve participation of women, and to evaluate the results of the program's activities.



PROCEDURE

From April 2023 to March 2024, the Deepshikha Centre hosted seven meetings of PSC leaders, the Nandanvan Centre hosted nine meetings of PSC leaders, the Asha Centre hosted ten meetings of committee leaders, and the Nirmaljyothi Centre hosted twelve meetings of PSC leaders. A total of 38 meetings were conducted. The above goal was achieved during the meeting.

CHALLENGES

An issue developed in inspiring women to join the committee by visiting the community and providing information about the initiative and training. Some committee members did not attend the meeting on time owing to personal reasons.

ATTAINMENTS

The Project Steering Committee (PSC) set the above objectives, which were achieved. During the meeting, committee members discussed the trainees' training-related personal and social concerns and provided positive guidance and solutions. The members' involvement in the different training sessions taken up until the scheme's conclusion was favourable, and those who worked did an excellent job of bringing in people to participate in the program..

SIX MONTH TRAINING COMPLETION EXAM

After 6 months of tailoring training, Deepika Patil administered the tailoring exam at four different centres. Deepshikha Centre -24, Nandanvan Centre-23, Nirmaljyoti Centre-22, and Asha Centre-05 trainees, a total of 74 women have passed the exam. Following the examination, all of the trainees received certificates.



SOCIO-LEGAL PROTECTION TRAINING

OBJECTIVE

To help beneficiaries understand the country's laws and schemes, as well as how to use the government's existing services and schemes to protect themselves from gender discrimination and violence, through books and other ways. Distribute information materials on schemes and services to participants and their families. Teach them how to apply for applicable schemes.

PROCEDURE AND STRATEGY

The instructor assumed responsibility for the program. Women were given information about the aforesaid training program during visits to specified areas and centres in order to encourage their participation by inspiring them toward self and societal awareness. Training-related pre-assessment forms were filled out following a visit to the centre. Following the training, post-test forms had been filled out to determine the individuals' improved survival rates. Participants will be given information about schemes and services.

On June 17, 2023, the organization held a social legal protection training program at the Asha Centre. Adv. Devisha Dahikar was present throughout the program and spoke about women's rights. 29 women participated in the program, as did community members.



The Indian Centre for Integrated Development organized a Social Legal Protection program on June 20, 2023, at the Nirmaljyothi Centre and the Deepshikha Centre. Sakhi One Stop's AD Amrita Ghoge and Centre Administrator Anagha Moghe presented information about the facilities available at Sakhi One Stop Centre. The program was attended by 54 beneficiaries from Nirmaljyothi Centre and others, as well as 44 beneficiaries from Deepshikha Centre.

On July 21, 2023, the Nandanvan Centre hosted a social legal protection program. Adv. Smita Sarode, present in the program, Sakhi One Stop Centre from Sahyog Trust, and Anagha Moghe (Center Administrator) from here, guided on themes such as equality, domestic violence, government schemes, laws and rights, and so on.



ATTAINMENT

The aforementioned objectives of the social legal protection training program were achieved. During the program, participants were appropriately guided by the attendees. The participants became aware and some of them were referred to the Sakhi One Stop Centre.

REPRODUCTIVE AND GENERAL HEALTH EDUCATION

OBJECTIVE

To promote cleanliness-related appropriate thoughts among women through reproductive and general health education. To eliminate the distinction between appropriate and inappropriate cleanliness. To assist beneficiaries in effectively managing their health and their family's health through training.

METHOD AND STRATEGY

The responsibility for the program was assigned to the instructor. Information related to the aforementioned training program was provided to increase participation by encouraging women

towards self and family health awareness during visits to designated communities and centres. Pre-assessment forms were filled out after visiting the centres for training. Post-assessment forms were completed after training to assess the increase in awareness among participants. Participants were provided with a cleanliness-related guidance booklet.

Under the Indian Centre for Integrated Development organization, a program on reproductive and general health was conducted at Nirmaljyothi Centre on 13.9.2023 and at Deepshikha Centre on 22.9.2023. Dr. Vijaya Lanje and Dr. Sonali Shelke, as chief mentors, were present at the program. Guidance on the cleanliness and usage of personal hygiene products during menstruation, as well as the early symptoms of breast cancer, the adverse effects of lack vitamin, iron, anaemia, proper nutrition, etc., was provided. A total of 63 women and adolescents participated at Nirmaljyothi Centre, and 59 people participated at Deepshikha Centre.

OUTCOME:

The objectives of the reproductive and general health education training program were achieved as per the aforementioned objectives. During the program, appropriate questions were asked to the guiding person by the participants.

MAKAR SANKRANTI PROGRAM

OBJECTIVE

To provide a platform for women through the Makar Sankranti and Haldi Kumkum program where women from the community can come together to celebrate this day, share their experiences, and bond.

PROCEDURE

On 9th February 2024, Asha Centre and Nandanvan Centre organized the Makar Sankranti and Haldi Kumkum program here. The importance of this day in Indian culture was explained by the volunteers, and afterwards, light refreshments were provided for the participating women. A total of 17 students from the Asha Centre and 22 students from the Nandanvan Centre participated in the program.



OUTCOME

The participation of women in the organized Makar Sankranti and Haldi Kumkum program was commendable. Through the program, women were empowering themselves.

INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY

On 3rd March 2024, on the occasion of International Women's Day, Nari Shakti Mahotsav was organized by the Indian Centre for Integrated Development, Nagpur, at CJ Sebastian Hall, Seminary Hills.

The event saw the participation of 270 women from the organization's working area. The program included guidance on cyber safety for women by API Sharda Bhopade and a session on managing stress in life by speaker Manisha Deshmukh. Moreover, Adv. Megha Burange provided suitable guidance on women's security, justice system, and related laws.



DEEPSHIKHA BALWADI

OBJECTIVE

To empower the children of the intended communities by promoting primary education, hygiene and recreation.

METHOD AND STRATEGY

Teaching children aged 3 to 6 the fundamentals of languages like English and Hindi, as well as hygiene, through images, songs, and other techniques. Taking regular sessions with the children on personal cleanliness.

ATTAINMENT

Balwadi had a positive response from the children in the neighbourhood, and the participation of women and men in various events organized was praiseworthy.



CHALLENGES

Members of the community usually go for begging. Workspace is restricted.

OUTREACH

A survey was conducted in the Anthujinagar, Abbumiyagar, Tulshinagar, and Gond communities. 56 youngsters were enrolled in the Balwadi. A total of 45 children attend Balwadi regularly.

RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES

Catch the ball, musical chair, in-out, racing, carrom, badminton, come-go activity, ice water, as well as asking the colours name through the game.

COMMUNITY VISIT

- During the visits, 185 women, 65 men, 475 children, and 190 families were contacted, for a total of 825 individuals.

- Parents were informed about the Balwadi studies during house visits in Tulshinagar, Abbuniyagar, and Gond Mohalla.
- It has been seen in the communities that more and more men stay at home, mothers take their children to beg, and some children attend school. People are living in an unsanitary atmosphere. Parents were informed about their children's daily nutrition, health, lifestyle, and hygiene.
- During the visits, team members met with parents whose children had been dropped from school and assisted them in getting their children readmitted.



COMMUNITY LIBRARY

OBJECTIVE

To provide children, women, and adolescent girls in the community with access to diverse books and newspapers through the library, as well as to expand their knowledge.

The Deepshikha Centre's library served 43 people in total. In the library, the children learned about the events by reading the newspaper, discussing the events, and getting information about various schemes through the newspaper, as well as reading the library's poems, stories, general knowledge, the book of Great Leaders, getting information about kitchen tips, and books like Chatur Birbal, Swar Jan, Goshti Goshti Gamtichya, and so on. The children of the community visit the centre to spend their time.



OTHER PROGRAMS

- On June 17, 2023, Konkan Gramin Bank hosted an event at Deepshikha Centre. Employees provided information about the bank's rules and facilities, as well as government and insurance schemes, among other things. Women - 24 adolescent girls - 7 participated. A total of 31 people participated.
- On November 20, 2023, Deepshikha Centre held a children's day program and gave information on child protection. Various enjoyable activities were also conducted for the children. A total of 112 people participated.
- Vaccination programs were held at Deepshikha Centre throughout the year in partnership with Asha workers employed by the Municipal Corporation. Children and pregnant women were immunized against diseases, and people were educated about the importance and benefits of immunization. 87 women and 107 children were immunized, for a total of 194 beneficiaries.

To observe issues faced by the children and their in the community, offering advice, and planning events pertaining to a range of community concerns.
- The Deepshikha Centre tuition teacher reached out to 347 households in Tulsi Nagar, Abbumiya Nagar, Suraj Magar, Gond Community, Oriya Mohalla, and Antoji Nagar, while the Nirmaljyothi Centre tuition teacher reached out to 278 families of Gittikhdan, Bheem Tekdi, Vishwas Nagar, Kolpura and Gond Mohalla and the Asha Centre tuition teacher reached out to 452 families of Hazaripahad, New Basti and Krishna Nagar
- The parents of the children were briefed about the tuition classes and explained the importance of education. Parents and guardians were also informed about the health and hygiene of the children. Visiting the homes of the absent children, the topics of their absence were discussed and motivated to send their children for tuition classes regularly.

Because these meetings were the first of their kind, a team member provided a brief overview of the organization and its work in Nagpur. Parents were encouraged to send their children to both tuition and school. Parents were instructed to monitor their children's academic performance, health, hygiene, and behaviour. Previously, tuition lessons were free for children, and as a result, parents and children did not take them seriously, and children did not attend the classes on a regular basis. To address this issue, a token amount of Rs.50 has been set as monthly fee. Parents were also encouraged to actively participate in the organization's programs and activities for children, adolescent girls, and women.

KISHORI PROGRAMME FOR ADOLESCENT GIRLS

OBJECTIVES

- To provide adolescent girls with knowledge and skills to support their reproductive health.
- Promote life skills, reproductive health education, and hygiene behaviours among adolescent girls.
- Encourage and build capacity to create a safe atmosphere in the community, as well as to enable adolescent females develop resilience and freedom of expression.

Total number of Kishori Meetings: 97, with 357 Kishori participating. During the meeting, the challenges encountered by adolescent girls were discussed in the group, and appropriate measures were adopted. The detrimental consequences of cell phones, lifestyle, menstruation, school admissions, college admissions, family conflicts, and so on were discussed.

ATTAINMENTS:

In the meeting, the adolescent girls felt a sense of togetherness, the adolescent girls put their opinion and their problem in the meeting and they expressed their opinions and problems, which were solved through discussion

Challenges:

Girls do not speak openly and are hesitant to discuss sensitive matters. Girls use cell phones more frequently in meetings. Most girls attend school infrequently.

LIFE SKILL EDUCATION

OBJECTIVE

To provide adolescent girls with knowledge and skills by teaching them about reproductive health, cleanliness, and other topics through life skills education, in order to promote their reproductive health. Motivating and developing the potential to contribute to freedom of expression and opinion.

A total of 66 life skills sessions were conducted with 28 groups in 22 communities with a total participation of 357 adolescent girls.
